**GVR Hunting and Fishing Club's Use of Raised Funds
as of April 1, 2026**

\$1,600 - Help purchase a positive pressure breathing apparatus for use by the Santa Cruz Valley Fire Department EMT staff on emergency calls during the pandemic.

\$29,600 - Funding college scholarships for Sahuarita School District High School seniors pursuing a degree in Wildlife Management, Environmental Education, Fisheries Management, Conservation or related courses of study through the Sahuarita Educational Enrichment Foundation (SEEF).

\$3,500 - Support the air gun shooting, orienteering and ranger programs of the Sahuarita School District's Navy Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps program.

\$3,500 - Fund youth outreach (\$2,000) sponsored by Safari Club International Foundation and a youth hunting education camp (\$1,500) sponsored by Safari Club International Arizona Chapter.

\$1,650 - Fund the environmental education program, Trout in the Classroom, at Walden Grove High School. Trout eggs and fish tanks are provided while students and a participating teacher monitor and feed the eggs as they hatch and grow into fingerlings.

\$900 - Sponsored and funded travel expenses for two high school teachers from Sahuarita High School to attend a weeklong class in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, to learn about the outdoors and various activities relating to hunting, conservation, and their impact on the environment.

\$1,500 - Co-supported three family fishing events at Sahuarita Lake with emphasis on youth fishing.

\$500 - Sponsor a high school conservation Club at Walnut Grove High School.

\$1,750 - Provided funding in 2023, 2024 and 2025 in support of three Family Day events sponsored by Southern Arizona Quail Forever Chapter held at Empire Ranch. No Fee/All Ages Welcome.

\$500 -2026, Empire Ranch Foundation in support of providing outdoor experiences for all ages.
